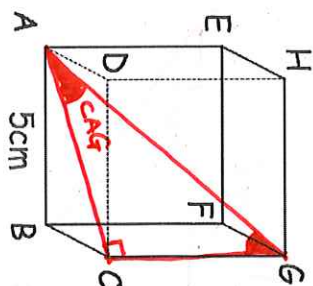

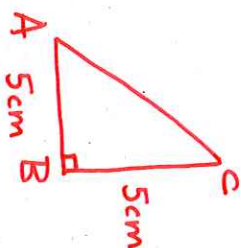

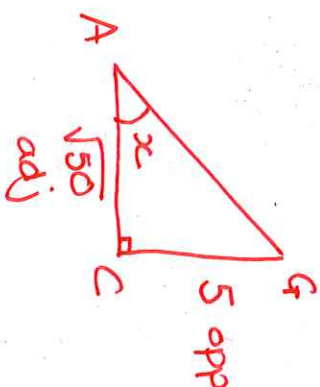
1. Shown is a cube with side length 5cm.



Calculate angle CAG.



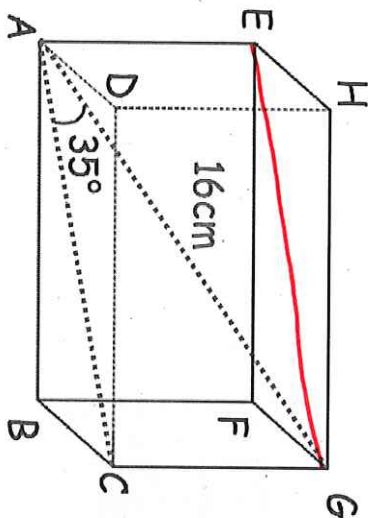
$$AC = \sqrt{5^2 + 5^2} = \sqrt{50}$$



35.3

$$\tan^{-1}\left(\frac{5}{\sqrt{50}}\right) = 35.264$$

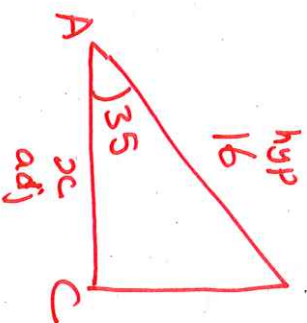
2. Shown below is a cuboid.



Length AG = 16cm
Angle CAG is 35°

Work out the length of EG.

$$EG = AC$$

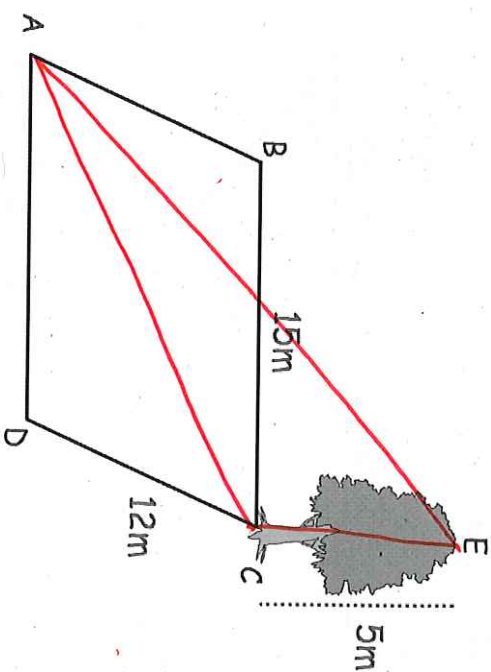


$$\cos 35 = \frac{x}{16}$$

$$16 \cos 35 = x$$

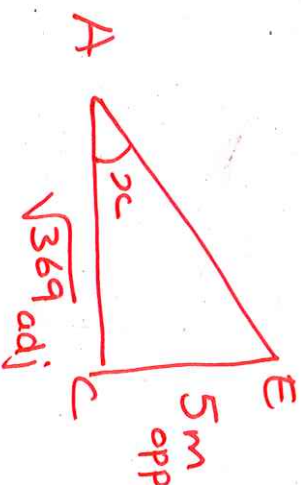
3. A tree is located in the corner of a rectangular field.



The field is 15 metres long and 12 metres wide.
The tree is 5 metres tall.

Calculate angle CAE.

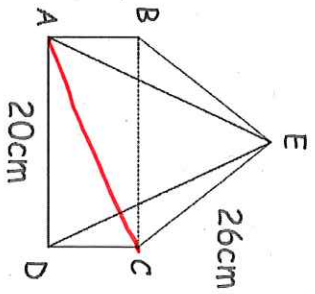
$$AC = \sqrt{15^2 + 12^2} = \sqrt{369}$$



$$\tan^{-1} \left(\frac{5}{\sqrt{369}} \right)$$

4. Shown below is a square based pyramid. The apex E is directly over the centre of the base.



AD = 20cm
CE = 26cm

- (a) Work out the length of AC

$$AC = \sqrt{20^2 + 20^2} = \sqrt{800} = 28.3 \text{ cm} \quad (2)$$

- (b) Calculate angle CAE

$$\cos^{-1}\left(\frac{\frac{1}{2}\sqrt{800}}{26}\right) = 57.0^\circ \quad (2)$$

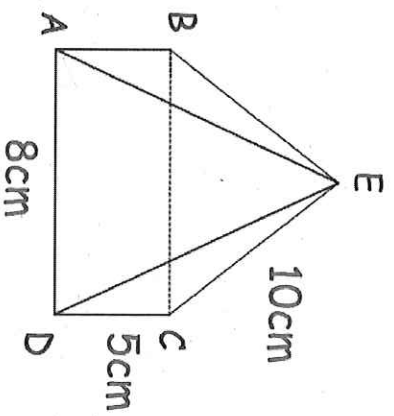
- (c) Work out the height of the pyramid

$$26 \sin 57^\circ = 21.8 \text{ cm} \quad (2)$$

- (d) Calculate the volume of the pyramid

$$\frac{1}{3} \times (20 \times 20) \times 21.8 = 2906.7 \text{ cm}^3 \quad (2)$$

5. Shown below is a rectangular based pyramid. The apex E is directly over the centre of the base.



AD = 8cm
CD = 5cm
CE = 10cm

- (a) Calculate the height of the pyramid

$$AC = \sqrt{5^2 + 8^2} = \sqrt{89}$$

- (b) Calculate angle between the face ABE and the base ABCD

$$\cos^{-1}\left(\frac{\frac{1}{2}\sqrt{89}}{10}\right) = 61.9^\circ \quad (3)$$
